Understanding of the World

Geography Focus: What happens when the season changes from autumn to winter?

Design: How can we express ourselves through art? Find out about Yaykoi Kusama and her life and how she expressed herself.


Yaykoi Kusama is a Japanese artist who creates sculpture.

Music: exploring sounds when singing

- Singing uses our voices to make music.
- When singing, we can change the pitch (high/low) of our voice.
- We can also change the volume (loud quiet) of our voice.
- We can create our own songs and tunes using the above (and sometimes rhyming).




Unique Sketch Self portrait Colour Mixing Express

- Learning four jumps and how to complete them safely: Star jump, tuck jump, straight jump, half turn jump.
- Learn five rolls and how to complete them safely: Egg roll, dish roll, teddy bear roll, back roll and pencil roll.
- Balance on two and three points and hold.
- Link a jump, roll and balance to form a sequence.
- Begin to use gymnastics equipment safely.
