If you have a child due to start in Reception in September 2026, please remember to submit your application to Lincolnshire County Council by **15 January 2026**. National Offer Day is **16 April 2026**. You will be notified of your child's allocated school on or after this date. If you need support with your application, please contact the school office

Open Mornings

We warmly welcome parents and children who would like to look around the school before submitting their application for a primary school place for September 2026. Appointments are available on the mornings of Monday 13th October, Wednesday 22nd October, Wednesday 12th November and Thursday 8th January. Please contact the school office for an appointment. If you do not have a child due to start in September 2026 but know someone who does, please pass on this information – we'll be very happy to meet them and show them around our school.

If you can't make those dates, please let us know and we'll do our best to accommodate you.

Cool Milk

School Meals

Our meals are provided by Good Lookin' Cookin', and are very popular with the children (and adults) who order them. All infant children are entitled to a free school meal so please do take advantage of this. You can order meals in advance, using Good Lookin' Cookin's website. If you are unsure whether your child is entitled to free school meals in Key Stage Two, please see a member of the office staff.

Nut-Free School

Due to allergies, we are a nut-free school. Please help us to keep children safe by not sending any items that contain nuts in pack-ups.

Parking – a perennial issue?

Please bear in mind that the zig-zags are there to protect the children, and park accordingly. There is ample parking close by.

You may have noticed the mobile parking enforcement camera car that was parked close to school recently, and you are doubtless aware that parking enforcement officers regularly monitor parking around school.

Our neighbours have recently contacted school to say that their driveways have been blocked at school drop-off and pick-up times. Again, please bear their needs in mind when parking around school. At collection time, we will always keep your children safe until you get to the playground, and we can happily wait the extra minute or two so that you can park safely and considerately.

Parent Governor

Safeguarding

I am the Designated Safeguarding Lead in school, and Mr. Simpson is the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead this year. If you have any concerns, please raise them with either of us.

End of day - playground

Having consulted with colleagues, we plan to introduce the following measures to ensure the playground is clear for use until home-time, and to give parents and younger children a safe place to wait away from the road.

By 2.55pm, a member of staff will open the gates onto the driveway leading up to Pre-School. The hand-gate from the driveway to the playground will remain locked, as will the wooden gate onto the main road, until 3:10pm. If you are collecting a child from Pre-School, please head round to the driveway gates rather than through the playground. We will start this from Monday 29th September.

Water and water bottles

We expect that children drink water during the school day. We recommend the plastic bottles that we can provide for a small charge (ask at the office). If children bring other bottles, please bear in mind that they need to fit inside the water bottle carriers.

Harvest Festival

On Friday 3rd October, we are celebrating Harvest festival at St. Andrew's Church. We know that many families are finding the cost of living difficult, so we would like to show our support for a local food bank, the Lincoln Larder.

As a last thought, I want to leave you with a passage from a book I was recently introduced to at a Diocesan Meeting – 'Braiding Sweetgrass' by Robin Wall Kimmerer. She is a botanist and indigenous American, and in the book she writes about how corn, squash and bean plants fare less well when they are planted separately, but thrive together:

'Alone, a bean is just a vine, squash an oversize leaf. Only when standing together with corn does a whole emerge which transcends the individual. The gifts of each are more fully expressed when they are nurtured together than alone. In ripe ears and swelling fruit, they counsel us that all gifts are multiplied in relationship.'

I trust that together, we – our school and the children, you the parents and carers, and our local community – can all thrive.
